In New Zealand the above-mentioned animals are introduced species, not native fauna. They are not species threatened with extinction by international trade.

No documentation is required under New Zealand's Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989 to export any farmed or hunted trophies, meat, skins, antlers, fur (and all parts and derivatives), from the species listed above.

I can confirm that the species Cervus elaphus hanglu, Cervus elaphus barbarus, Cervus elaphus bactrianus, Dama dama mesopotamica, Capra hircus aegagrus, Odocoileus virginianus mayensis, Lagorchestes hirsutus, Lagostrophus fasciatus and Onychogalea fraenata are not present in New Zealand.
